3/ This Academic Council of the University of Delhi expresses the highest regard for the University Grants Commission and after a great deal of deliberation resolves to bring to the attention and notice of the UGC certain facts that will throw light on the matters raised in the UGC order dated 20 June 2014 addressed to the University of Delhi.

The Academic Council believes that in view of the modifications and clarifications, the undergraduate programme as resolved and presented below is in compliance with the National Policy on Education (10+2+3) and with the concern's of the UGC.

- The Academic Council notes that students seeking admission this year, that is, 2014-15 will be admitted into a three years Bachelor's degree programme ( BA/BSc/BCom) in their Discipline I (Major subject) and will graduate with the corresponding degree on the completion of three years. The Academic Council reiterates that the undergraduate programme with multiple degree options allows each student to gain a B.A./B.Sc./B.Com Degree after completing three years. It resolves to award this B.A. / B.Sc./B.Com degree with mention (as allowed under UGC regulations) of the subject in which the student has majored.
- Thus the Academic Council urges the UGC to view this programme as being in conformity with the National Policy on Education. The Academic Council also wishes to draw the attention of the UGC to the fact that a large number of educational institutions in the country including some directly under the Central Government have been offering a Bachelors programme of a four year duration for several years.
- The Academic Council further clarifies that the fourth year of study is an optional year for those students who wish to obtain a BA Honours /BSc Honours /BCom Honours/BTech UG degree. Furthermore, students who graduate in Discipline 1 will in addition also be eligible for enrollment at the PG level based on their Discipline 2 option (Minor).
- The University has also resolved to devise ways and means in the shortest time possible for creating a credit mechanism that will ensure that an Honours degree holder of the University of Delhi shall be able to obtain a Masters degree at the University of Delhi within the total span of five years after senior secondary as has happened in the past.
- The students who were admitted last year, that is, in 2013-14 to the undergraduate degree programme in the various constituent colleges of the University are already pursuing a course of study towards a BA/BSc/BCom degree in their respective Discipline I (major). No change is required in the course structure to enable them to graduate in three years from their date of admission i.e. in 2016.

- The Academic Council also wishes to bring to the notice of the UGC that the admission process has witnessed extra ordinarily large number of students who have already submitted their applications and assuming that the same number shall be essentially seeking admissions to any other scheme if so decided at any stage, the logistics involved are enormous and will consume a huge amount of time since revised courses of study will have to be approved through a proper process starting from seeking approval of various statutory bodies at the most basic level all the way up to the Academic Council, the Executive Council and the University Court. Thus the academic session will be delayed considerably in terms of the time involved.

9/ Resolved that the recommendations of the Faculty of Science dated 22<sup>nd</sup> April, 2013 regarding revision of quantum for science Meritorious Award and raising the allocation under 'Budget Head' "Meritorious Award to B.Sc. (H) and M.Sc. Students be approved :

- Note: i) The Standing Committee of Science Departments at its meeting held on 18.01.2013 opined that amount of Meritorious Award i.e. ₹ 3,00,000/- (₹ Three Lakh only) is a very small amount and as such recommended that the amount may be enhanced from ₹ 3,00,000/- to ₹ 12,00,000/-.
- ii) The Faculty considered and approved the recommendations of the Standing Committee of the Science Meritorious Award to the Students of B.Sc. (Hons.) and M.Sc. for the academic year 2012-2013 at its meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> January, 2013. After detailed discussions, the Faculty observed that due to increase of cost of books, the value of the awards for Under-graduate (Hons.) of ₹ 800/- and for Post-graduate of ₹ 1200/- fixed twelve years back is to be insufficient and unanimously recommended that Science Meritorious Awards to B.Sc. (Hons.) and M.Sc. Students be enhanced to ₹ 3,000/- and ₹ 5,000/- respectively to enable the awardees to buy books worth of reading.
- iii) The Faculty also considered that the budget allocation for Meritorious Award i.e. ₹ 3,00,000/- (₹ Three Lakh only) is a very small amount and as such recommended that the amount may be enhanced from ₹ 3,00,000/- to ₹12,00,000/-.

**Dr. Dev Raj Seth & Smt. Sushila Seth Scholarship**

1. There shall be one scholarship to be known as "Dr. Dev Raj Seth & Smt. Sushila Seth Scholarship" to be awarded every year to two girl students studying in Delhi University out of the annual income accrued from the endowment of Rs.50,00,000/- (Rupees Fifty Lakhs Only) made by Dr. Mira Seth.
2. The Scholarship shall be awarded to two meritorious girl students with inadequate means pursuing studies at the Master's level in the following courses on a rotational basis: 1. M.Tech. (Microwave); 2. M.Sc. in Nursing; 3. M.Sc. in Physics; 4. M.Sc. in Chemistry; 5. M.Sc. in Mathematical Sciences; 6. M.Sc. in Statistics; 7. M.Sc. in Operational Research; 8. M.Sc. in Computer Science; 9. M.A in Economics; 10. MBA (Full Time) in Management Studies; 11. M.Sc. in Environmental Biology; 12. M.Tech. (in any discipline); and 13. M.E. (in any discipline).
3. The value of the scholarship shall be Rs. 8,000/- p.m. each for ten academic months or the income accrued from the corpus, whichever is less, and will be tenable for two year's duration of the course. The scholarships would be renewed in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year subject to the awardee's passing the 1st year examination.
4. No student shall be eligible for award of this scholarship if she already holds a scholarship awarded by Delhi University or any other University or the Central Government or any State Government or Private Body, other than freeship.
5. In case a scholar accepts any other scholarship/financial assistance from any other source she shall be required to refund the amount received by her on this account from the date she accepts the other scholarship/ financial assistance.
6. If it should appear at any time during the tenure of the award that any student has failed to make satisfactory progress or has been found guilty of gross-misconduct or has been very irregular in attendance, it shall, after due warning in writing, be reported by the Head of the Institution/ Department to the University, who may reduce, suspend or withdraw her scholarship.

7. The scholarship shall be awarded by the University on the recommendation of a Selection Committee consisting of the following:-
  1. Dean, Faculty concerned
  2. Head, Department concerned
  3. Two senior teachers of the Department concerned
8. The payment of the scholarships shall be released to the students through the Head of the Institution from July each year on presentation of a bill along with a certificate to the effect that during the period covered in the bill/s the students were not in receipt of any other scholarship/ financial assistance from any other source.
9. The unutilized amount in any year shall be added to the corpus of the endowment fund.

### **Background**

1. The Academic Council vide Resolution No. 26 dated 16.08.2013 resolved that the recommendations of the Inspection Committee dated 20.06.2013 constituted by the Vice-Chancellor for conversion of Ram Lal Anand College (Evening) into a full fledged Day College be accepted and recommended for consideration by the Executive Council. It further resolved that the name of College shall be Aryabhata College.
2. The Executive Council at its meeting held on 17.08.2013 vide Resolution No. 7(5) accepted in principle the recommendations of the Academic Council regarding conversion of Ram Lal Anand College (Evening) into full-fledged Day College. It also accepted that the name of the College shall be Aryabhata College.
3. In pursuance of above, a notification was issued on 24.10.2013.
4. The University Grants Commission vide letter dated 26<sup>th</sup> March 2014 made necessary change in the list of Colleges maintained under Section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act 1956 and included Aryabhata College as full-fledged Day College.

### **Ordinance XX (M) – Aryabhata College**

1. The University shall maintain and run, **Aryabhata College**, Benito Juarez Road, New Delhi.
2. The Executive Council shall constitute for the College, a Governing Body to administer affairs of the college, constituted as follows:
  - (i) A person appointed by the Vice-Chancellor – Chairperson
  - (ii) Treasurer (Ex-officio)
  - (iii) The Principal of the College (Ex-officio) – Member-Secretary
  - (iv) Not less than five and not more than eight members appointed by the Executive Council, not necessarily from among themselves.
  - (v) Two members of the teaching staff from among the teaching staff by rotation according to seniority for a term of one year. One of the teachers representative shall be from among those with more than 10 years' service, and one from among those with less than 10 years' service; if, however, eligible candidates are not available in one of those categories, both the representatives may be taken from the other.

Provided that a teacher who has become member of the Governing Body of the College under the category of teachers with less than ten years' service and completes ten years' service during the term of membership as such, will nevertheless continue to be a member of the Governing Body for the full term of one year.

3. Members, other than the ex-officio members, shall hold office for a period of one year.

4. Subject to the general control and supervision of the Executive Council, and subject to the provisions of the Act, the Statutes, the Ordinances of the University, the Governing Body shall exercise the following powers and functions:
  - (a) to organize the teaching in the college and to determine teaching requirements of the college;
  - (b) to admit students to the various courses as per rules laid down by the Academic Council from time to time, resident and non-resident, and to prescribe the fees to be paid by them; and to prescribe rules for the residence, health discipline and welfare of students;
  - (c) to submit to the Executive Council an estimate of the income and expenditure of the College and to incur expenditure within the limits fixed in the budget approved by the Executive Council;
  - (d) to consider the Annual Accounts along with the Audit Report and after approval to submit the same to the Executive Council for information along with its comments;
  - (e) to create, appoint, suspend or terminate the services of the administrative and other non-academic staff and to determine their emoluments and conditions of service;
 

Provided that the qualifications for appointment, emoluments and conditions of service of such persons shall be in accordance with those laid down by the Executive Council for similar posts in the University;
  - (f) to appoint the principal and the teaching staff on the recommendations of the Selection Committee appointed for the purpose, subject to the approval of the appointment of the Principal and the recognition of the teaching staff by the Executive Council;
  - (g) to grant leave to teachers and other staff according to the rules framed for the purpose;
  - (h) to define the duties and responsibilities of the Principal, teaching staff and administrative staff of the college; and
  - (i) to do such other acts as may be necessary for the exercise of the above functions.
5. Subject to the general supervision of the Governing Body, the College shall have a Staff Council as provided under Clause 6 of Ordinance – XVIII, as amendments from time to time.
6. The appointment of Principal, members of teaching staff, Librarian, Director of Physical Education and others, shall be made as provided under Clause 7 of Ordinance – XVIII, as amended from time to time.

- (iii) in NSS activities at the college level, and take part in any outreach programmes/camps organized by the NSS, or

- (iv) in cultural activities at the college level, represent the college at cultural festivals after due selection by the Principal/Head, or represent the college or the University at Delhi/NCR region after due selection through recognized bodies.

May be given a credit of maximum 8 marks in each foundation course in the relevant semester.

- (3) Each College shall set up a committee consisting of at least five teachers and chaired by the Principal to formulate guidelines and policies to monitor the performance/hours spent/outcomes of such students as indicated in sub-clause (2) above, in the consultation with the teachers in charge of NCC/NSS/cultural activities/physical education. This committee shall determine the individual credit of marks (ranging from 0-8 marks) to be allotted to such students who are eligible under sub-clause (1) and (2) above.

22. In approving on 30.04.2014 the following guidelines for allotment of DC-II courses to the students entering the IIIrd Semester of the Four Year Undergraduate Programme:
1. The Colleges which are offering DC-I in any subject may offer DC-II course in that particular subject.
  2. If in a college, a certain subject is not being offered as DC-I, then that subject can be offered as DC-II only if a Department of that subject exists in the College or if the UGC/Govt. approved faculty position is available in the subject (within the sanctioned strength) to be offered as DC-II.
  3. In subjects wherein only DC-II has been approved by the University of Delhi, such as Linguistics, Buddhist Studies, Operations Research, Adult Education and East Asian Studies, colleges may offer any of these subjects as DC-II if there is an existing Department or faculty is available in that particular subject in the College.
  4. The DC-II courses in Management Studies can be offered by those Colleges which are offering Management Studies as DC-I subject.
  5. However, if a College is not offering Management Studies as DC-I subject, then it may offer Management Studies as DC-II subject only by available existing faculty (this should not lead to any changes in the faculty strength of any department) as per details given below:
    - a) If the number of sections in Commerce or any other subject in any college is up to 3, then the college may start one section of DC-II in any one of the six functional specializations of Management Studies.
    - b) If the number of sections in Commerce or any other subject in any college is up to 5, then the college may start two sections of DC-II in any one or two of the six functional specializations of Management Studies.
    - c) If the number of sections in Commerce or any other subject in any college is more than 5, then the college may start three sections of DC-II in any one, two or three of the six functional specializations of Management Studies.
  6. In case the number of students offering a particular subject as DC-II exceeds the number determined by the College for that particular subject then the allotment of DC-II course should be done in order of merit on the basis of aggregate of marks obtained by a student in all the Foundation and Applied Language Courses of Semester-I wherever applicable. While determining the merit for allotment of DC-II subject, reservation policy applicable in the University of Delhi for admission to DC-I should be followed.
  7. DC-II courses can be offered in a set of 6 papers of the same subject or it could be a combination of 3+3 papers of two subjects at the DC-II level. In case the College decides to offer the option of 3+3 papers at the DC-II level, then the choice will have to be made by the student out of the DC-II courses available in the given semester only.
  8. The Colleges are advised to organize counseling sessions of the students wherein teachers from each department should be present to inform the students as regards the various options available under DC-II so that the students can make an informed choice.



9. The minimum number of students required to start a particular DC-II course should be decided by the College judiciously keeping in view the availability of permanent faculty, infrastructure and interest of the students.
10. The decision regarding allocation of DC-II subjects should be taken by the Colleges before the end of 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester so that the time table can be framed and uploaded on the College website in time.
11. The information related with the subjects offered under DC-II by the College shall be sent to the O/o Dean, Students Welfare and a copy of the O/o O.S.D (Examinations) for maintaining the data for examination.
23. In approving on 02.05.2014 the relaxation on the minimum requirement of 2/3<sup>rd</sup> attendance for the students of the II and III year of the three year Under-graduate Programmes to appear in their respective examinations May/June 2014, as a special case, under Ordinance X-C of the University.

25. In approving on 05.05.2014 the following guidelines of admission to be followed for admission to the Four Year Undergraduate Programmes in the Regular Colleges for the academic session 2014-2015:

**Guidelines**

1. All the candidates interested in seeking admission in undergraduate courses in Delhi University are required to fill the pre-admission form either online or offline for all categories (General/OBC/SC/ST/PwD). This is mandatory for all candidates. There will be no pre-admission at the college level.
2. The candidates are allowed to fill only one common pre-admission form either online or offline.
3. The college is free to publish its prospectus which may provide information regarding the college, the courses offered and the number of seats in each course, fee structure, Extra Curricular Activities etc. No forms of any nature, pre-admission as well as admission, shall be included in the prospectus or sold/provided with the prospectus or otherwise before the announcement of cut-off lists.
4. There shall be no 'Additional Eligibility Criterion' for any category in any college/course.
5. The colleges who wish to give specific advantage to girl students in any course must inform the office of Dean, Students' Welfare and take prior permission. This may be published in the University's Information Bulletin, displayed on the University web-site and college web-site. Colleges are not permitted to change this criteria at any stage during the entire admission process.
6. Admission to the four year Undergraduate degree course shall be based on Discipline -1 (Major Discipline). The schedule of the admission process for all categories shall be notified by the University.
7. The colleges shall convey the cut-off marks for the various courses (for the General/OBC/SC/ST/PwD categories) to the University, as per the schedule announced by the University. The college shall determine the cut-off marks prudently on the basis of the past experience and the class XII results of the School Boards. The office of Dean Students' Welfare shall make available the information regarding the results of various School Boards (whichever are available) to the colleges.
8. The University on receiving the cut-off marks from the various colleges will collate the data in the office of Registrar and notify the same through print and electronic media as per schedule. The cut-offs will also be displayed on the University Web-site (<http://du.ac.in>), college website and college notice board.
9. The colleges shall admit all the candidates who have marks that meet the announced cut-off criteria. No first-come-first served policy is permitted.
10. After declaration of the cut off lists by the University, the student will need to report to the college of his/her choice for admission within the stipulated period. At this stage, the candidate would be required to fill the college admission form and the University enrolment form. The candidate would then get his/her documents verified, submit the same to the college and pay the admission fees.
11. In case, a student cancels his admission in a college, in order to move to another college on declaration of a subsequent cut off lists or needs certificates for institutions outside Delhi University, the college must promptly return the documents to the student.

12. No student will be allowed to take admission in two courses/colleges simultaneously. In case, a candidate is found admitted in two courses/colleges simultaneously, the admission in all courses/colleges will be cancelled.
13. The University will organize open days in order to disseminate information on various admission related aspects and also to answer any queries that the students may have. The colleges are free to organize open days at their end and to set up help lines and web based assistance.
14. For admission under the reserved categories of Kashmiri Migrants/Children of War Widows, the admission process shall continue to be centralized and conducted at the University level by the office of Deputy Registrar, Academic.
15. All those candidates who are covered under any of the categories of reservation for children of War Widows/Kashmiri Migrants must register separately online/ offline if they wish to be considered for any other category (Gen./OBC/SC/ST/PwD).
16. For courses where admissions are done through entrance exams, separate procedures shall apply.
17. For admission under the Sports and ECA (Extra Curricular Activities) categories, the Colleges may use their own Sports/ECA application forms. These application forms shall be made available by the concerned college. The admission to these categories shall be on the basis of guidelines issued by the university.
18. The University shall set up Special Admission Assistance Teams and monitoring committees which will visit colleges throughout the admission process for assistance to students and monitoring the entire admission process.
19. The colleges are required to constitute their own Grievance Committees consisting of at least three teachers. The Members of the Grievance Committee so nominated should also be available in the College throughout the admission process. The details of the Grievance Committee members including their contact numbers (Mobile No.) should be put on the College Website and on college Notice Board.
20. The data of all candidates who are admitted to colleges must be made available on regular basis on college website immediately. The same may be compiled and sent to the University for information within a week of last date of admission.
21. The procedure for calculation of Best of Four percentage (wherein admission is done on the basis of Best of Four) is outlined hereunder.

**Academic Subjects and Procedure for Calculating Best of Four Percentage (For courses wherein admission is done on the basis of Best of Four)**

- I. The following Discipline I subjects offered by the University of Delhi for admission to undergraduate courses must be treated as Academic/Elective subjects for the purpose of admission. All other subjects offered by different boards may be treated as non-elective. All the Discipline I subjects must have at least a 70% component of theory exams (theory exam does not include internal assessment/continuous evaluation etc.) in the qualifying exam for the purpose of being treated as academic/elective subject.

- II. \*Accountancy will be treated as equivalent to Commerce wherever any board is not offering commerce as a subject.
- III. Biology and Business studies will be treated as academic/elective subjects. University may define any other relevant subjects as academic/elective for a particular Honours course.
- IV. <sup>#</sup>Home Science, Music, and Physical Education will be treated as academic/elective only for Honours in Home Science, Music and Physical Education (at IGIPSS only), respectively.

**V. Procedure for calculation of 'Best of Four' subjects percentage:-**

- a. One Language (Core/Elective/Functional)
- b. Subject in which admission is sought (Discipline I)
- c. Any two other academic/elective subjects (as defined earlier)

**Note:**

- (i) If a candidate has not studied the subject in which he/she is seeking admission in the Discipline I, then a disadvantage of 2% may be imposed on the calculated Best of Four percentage.
  - (ii) The colleges will have to consider only the academic/elective subject for calculation of Best of Four percentage if the candidate has studied at least four academic/elective subjects or one language and three academic/elective subjects.
  - (iii) In case a candidate has not studied three academic/elective subjects, then a disadvantage of 10% of the maximum marks may be levied on each such non-elective subject(s) to be included for the calculation of Best of Four percentage.
  - (iv) In case a candidate has studied three academic/elective subjects but wishes to include the percentage of non-elective subject(s) for the calculation of Best of Four, then a disadvantage of 10% of the maximum marks may be levied on each such non-elective subject(s) to be included for the calculation of Best of Four percentage.
  - (v) All the academic/elective subjects should have 70% component of theory exams (theory exam does not include internal assessment/continuous evaluation etc.). Otherwise these will be treated as non-elective subject.
  - (vi) In case a candidate has studied both elective and core in any languages, then core language will be treated as language, while elective language can be considered as academic/elective subject.
- VI. For admission to Honours in any language course, advantage of 2% in the Best of Four percentage may be given to those candidates who have studied the elective language. 2% disadvantage in the Best of Four percentage may be given to those who have studied functional language only. In case, a candidate has not studied the language at qualifying exam and is seeking admission in Honours in that language, he/she may be given a disadvantage of 5% in Best of Four percentage.

However, for admission to Honours in English and Hindi, the candidate must have studied the respective language and has to be included for calculation of Best of Four percentage.

Examples for calculation of 'Best of Four percentage' are given below.

<p><b>Example 1:</b> If a candidate is seeking admission in Honours in Commerce and Studied: Accounts (90), Business Studies (92), English (88) and Economics (94). Then his total marks are <math>90+92+88+94=364</math> and effective percentage is 91%</p>	<p><b>Example 2:</b> If a candidate is seeking admission in Honours in Commerce and Studied: Physics (96), Chemistry (92), English (90) and Mathematics (94). Then his total marks are <math>96+92+90+94=372</math> and Percentage 93%. But Effective Percentage is <math>93-2 = 91\%</math></p>
<p><b>Example 3:</b> If a candidate is seeking admission in Honours in Commerce and Studied: Accounts (88), Entrepreneurship (92), English(90) and Web Designing (94). Then, his total marks are <math>88+92+90+96=366</math>, Percentage is 91.5%. But Effective marks are <math>88+82(92-10)+90+84(94-10)=344</math> and effective Percentage is 86%.</p>	<p><b>Example 4:</b> If a candidate is seeking admission in Honours in English and Studied: Accounts (90), Business Studies (92), English (88) and Home Science (94). Then total marks are <math>90+92+88+94=364</math>, and Percentage is 91%. But effective marks are <math>90+92+88+84(94-10) = 354</math> and effective Percentage is 88.5%.</p>

- VII. The candidates must have studied mathematics at the qualifying exam for admission to Honours in Economics.
- VIII. The Basis of Selection for Mathematical Sciences/Science courses remains unchanged. However the subjects to be included for Basis of Selection (PCM/PCB/PCMB) must have at least 70% component of theory exams (theory exam does not include internal assessment/continuous evaluation etc.) in the qualifying exam otherwise a disadvantage of 10% of the maximum marks may be levied on each such subject.

**Procedures:**

1. Sportspersons who have Secured Position / Participated in International Tournament /Competition in Individual / Team Event/s as per Super Category will be given Direct Admission by the Department and are exempted to appear in the Department Entrance Test provided they fulfill the minimum percentage requirement at the time of filling the Application Form.
2. The Sports Admission Committee of the Delhi University Sports Council shall screen the applications, applied under the Sports Category and conduct the Fitness Test and Sports Trials and recommended Admission on the basis of Sports to the concerned Department as per Certificate Marking Chart enclosed (New Sports Policy 2014).
3. The concerned Department will sent a list of candidates who have applied under the Sports Category alongwith copies of Sports Certificates to the DUSC by the date to be decided by the DUSC.
4. The Number of Seats (Course-wise) to be filled by the Department under Sports Category should be communicated well in advance to the DUSC.
5. The level of competency in the Sports will be determined only of the Sportsperson who has achieved distinction in Sports during his / her year of study in Undergraduate Course/s in Sports / Games recognized by AIU and IOA. Preference will be given to Sports / Games in which Inter-University Competitions / Tournaments are held.
6. The DUSC must keep proper record of the candidates admitted under Sports category.
7. The candidate as per his / her age must be eligible to participate in Inter-Varsity Competition / Tournament for the next two years and should not be employed Part-Time / Full Time any where.
8. Candidate submitting false / fake certificate will be debarred from admission to any course in any Department for two years. If he / she is admitted his / her admission will be cancelled. Such cases will be notified to all Department.
9. A notification indicating the schedule of verification and Marking of Physical Fitness, and Sports Trials will be notified to all the Department/s by the Delhi University Sports Council.
10. The Admission to the Supernumerary Seats under the Sports Category be finalized by each Department i.e. the Marks obtained in Sports Trials to added to the Marks obtained in Department Entrance Test and a separate Sports Merit List be prepared. The Department will then make Admission as per the Sports Merit List. The Sports Merit List should be sent to DUSC for verifying the details and submission of Undertaking by candidate before depositing fees in their respective Department/s.
11. There shall be a Grievance Committee for Sports Admissions, constituted by the Vice Chancellor for grievances in this respect.
