Eminent persons in fields such as music, literature, visual and performing arts, journalism, business and industry, can also be appointed as Visiting Professors.
- (ii) Visiting Professors may be appointed for a period of up to one year and not less than two weeks. In exceptional circumstances, the duration may be extended to a maximum period of three years, with the approval of the Executive Council.
- (iii) Visiting Professors shall be invited to deliver a course of lectures or take seminars or participate in such other activities that help in advancing the teaching and research work of the University. They shall, however, not be members of any committee of the Department or of the University.
- (iv) A Visiting Professor will be paid in accordance with the following criteria:
 - (a) A Visiting Professor not receiving salary from the parent institution, will be paid gross entitlements attached to the post of Professor and free accommodation in the University, if available, or House Rent Allowance on maximum of Professor's Scale in the University. In case of retired persons, their pension will be deducted from the gross entitlements due to them.
 - (b) Those receiving salary from the parent institution, will be paid an honorarium fixed by the Executive Council from time to time. The Visiting Professor will also be entitled to rent free accommodation in the University, if available, or House Rent Allowance on the maximum of Professor's Scale in the University.

- (c) A Visiting Professor will be entitled to travel and research grants as determined by the Vice-Chancellor with the approval of the Executive Council. Medical expenses will be reimbursed as per University rules.
- (d) Visiting Professors invited from India or from outside the country may be paid Economy class airfare both ways by direct route.
- (v) Subject to the above, the Vice-Chancellor will determine with the approval of Executive Council, such other terms and conditions as may be required, including the duration and emolument of the appointment.

(2) Visiting Fellows

- (i) Scholars who have made notable contributions in one or more fields of study covered at the University may, with the approval of the Executive Council, be invited as Visiting Fellows by the Vice-Chancellor. Persons in other fields such as music, literature, visual and performing arts, journalism, business and industry could also be invited as Visiting Fellows.
- (ii) Visiting Fellows may be invited for a period up to one year and not less than two weeks to deliver a course of lectures or take seminars or participate in such other activities that help in advancing the teaching and research work of the University. In exceptional circumstances, the duration may be extended to a maximum period of three years, with the approval of the Executive Council. They shall, however, not be members of any committee of the Department or of the University.
- (iii) A Visiting Fellow will be paid in accordance with the following criteria:
 - (a) A Visiting Fellow not receiving salary from the parent institution, will be paid gross entitlements attached to the post of Professor/Associate Professor and rent free accommodation in the University, if available, or House Rent Allowance on the maximum of Professor's/ Associate Professor's scale.

- (b) A Visiting Fellow, receiving salary from the parent institution, will be paid an honorarium fixed by the Executive Council from time to time. The Visiting Fellow will be entitled to rent free accommodation in the University, if available, or House Rent Allowance on the maximum of Professor's/ Associate Professor's scale.
 - (c) A Visiting Fellow will be entitled to travel and research grants as determined by the Vice-Chancellor with the approval of the Executive Council. Medical expenses will be reimbursed as per University rules.
 - (d) A Visiting Fellow from India or from outside the country may be paid Economy class airfare both ways by direct route.
- (iv) Subject to the above, the Vice-Chancellor will determine, with the approval of Executive Council, such other terms and conditions as may be required, including the duration and emolument of the appointment.

Ord. XII-B. Honorary Professors

- (1) The Vice-Chancellor may recommend to the Academic Council, the appointment of an outstanding scholar or eminent person whose association with the University would enrich the academic activities of the University, as Honorary Professor. On the recommendation of the Academic Council, the Executive Council may confer the title.
- (2) The Head of the Department concerned, in consultation with colleagues in the Department, may propose to the Vice-Chancellor, the appointment of such a scholar or person as Honorary Professor. The Vice-Chancellor may, after satisfying himself, recommend the appointment to the Academic Council.

- (3) Honorary Professors may be invited to be associated with the academic activities of the University. They shall, however, not be members of any committee of the Department or of the University.
- (4) Honorary Professors will not carry with them any financial commitment for the University or the responsibility for providing residential accommodation. However, such Professors will be entitled to reimbursement of their local travel expenses as per rules of the University.

Ordinance XII-C. Adjunct Professors and Adjunct Fellows

(1) Adjunct Professors

(i) The Executive Council may, on the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor, appoint a distinguished academic who is currently on the faculty of another University or academic or research institution in India or abroad, whose association with the University would enhance the quality of the academic life of the University. The duration of such appointments in any one term will not be more than five years and could be renewed.

(ii) Adjunct Professors may be affiliated to one or more departments of the University. They are expected to be associated with the teaching and research activities at the departments. They may be allowed supervision of doctoral work on the basis of recommendation of the Department Research Council and the concerned Board of Research Studies. They shall, however, not be members of any committee of the Department or of the University.

(iii) Adjunct Professors will not receive any salary from the University, they will be paid an honorarium, fixed by the Executive Council from time to time, for teaching in the University. They will be entitled to reimbursement of

their local travel expenses as per rules of the University. The Department may provide suitable office space, if available.

(2) Adjunct Fellows

(i) The Executive Council may, on the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor, appoint an academic who is currently on the faculty of another University or academic or research institution in India or abroad, whose association with the University would enhance the quality of the academic life of the University. The duration of such appointments in any one term will not be more than five years and could be renewed.

(ii) Adjunct Fellows so appointed may be affiliated to one or more departments of the University. They are expected to be associated with the teaching and research activities in these departments. They may be allowed supervision of doctoral work on the basis of the recommendation of the Department Research Council and the concerned Board of Research Studies. They shall, however, not be members of any committee of the Department or of the University.

(iii) Adjunct Fellows will not receive any salary from the University, they will be paid an honorarium, fixed by the Executive Council from time to time, for teaching in the University. They will be entitled to reimbursement of their local travel expenses as per rules of the University. The Department/Departments may provide suitable office space, if available.

Ord. XII-D. Professor Emeritus

(i) The Vice-Chancellor may recommend to the Academic Council, after the retirement of a Professor of the University, the conferment of the title of

Professor Emeritus. The Executive Council may confer the title, on the recommendation of the Academic Council.

(ii) The title of Professor Emeritus will be conferred on a Professor of the University who has retired from the University after a total service of a minimum of ten years in the University with a minimum of five years service as Professor in the University. In exceptional circumstances, a retired Professor who has served for at least five years in the University as Professor may also be considered for the title of Professor Emeritus.

(iii) The title of Professor Emeritus will be conferred on scholars who have made outstanding contribution to their subject through their published research work and teaching.

(iv) A Professor Emeritus may pursue academic work in the Department to which the Professor is attached. To the extent possible, the Department shall make every possible effort to provide the Professor with facilities like a personal office, library access etc. The Professor, however, will not be a member of any committee of the Department or of the University.

(v) Emeritus Professorship will carry with it no financial commitment for the University or responsibility for providing residential accommodation.

(vi) The conferment of the title of Professor Emeritus will be for life.

MASTER OF COMPARATIVE LAWS (M.C.L.) DEGREE EXAMINATION

7. The courses of study, attendance, promotion, re-admission, examination, span period, discipline and other provisions applicable to LL.M. Two-Year Degree course shall *mutatis mutandis* apply to M.C.L. Degree course also. The Dean may, however, permit a student of M.C.L. to submit research paper in lieu of written examination in any of the courses. The research paper shall carry 100 marks. The student allowed to submit research paper in lieu of written examination must do so before the dispersal of classes of the concerned Term.

Further resolved that the consequential amendments/ additions/ modifications, if any, be made in the Ordinances.

The Council further resolved that the Faculty of Law should work out the possibility for discontinuation of the Master of Comparative Laws (M.C.L.) course w.e.f. Academic Year 2010-2011.

79/ The Council considered the proposal of the University Grants Commission regarding the scheme “Universities with Potential for Excellence” - accreditation of the University and its Colleges by NAAC (National Assessment Accreditation Council) vide its letter No. F. 31-54/2002 (IUC) dated 24th July, 2009 from the Chairman, University Grants Commission. After detailed deliberations on the issue, the Council resolved that under the present circumstances it is not possible for the University to accept the proposal.

80/ Resolved that the proposal of the University Grants Commission regarding the scheme “Universities with Potential for Excellence” - creation of Internal Quality Assurance Cell in the University be accepted and recommended to the Executive Council for approval.

The Council further resolved that the Vice-Chancellor be authorized to constitute a Committee to recommend the parameters for evaluation within the University.

82/ Resolved that the following amendment to Ordinance XXVII of the University be accepted and recommended to the Executive Council for approval:

Add the following after Sl. No.109:

110. Shri Bodhishwar Rai Scholarship

1. There will be one scholarship to be known as “Shri Bodhishwar Rai Scholarship” of the value of Rs.3,000/- p.m., or the amount of interest earned by the endowment of Rs.10,00,000/- endowed by Shri Dinkar Rai, son of late Shri Bodhishwar Rai, whichever is less. The scholarship will be tenable for two academic years.
2. The Scholarship will be awarded every year to a student of M.A.(Economics) Part I in the Delhi School of Economics, University of Delhi on Merit-cum-

Means basis. The selection of student for award of these scholarship will be based on his/her parental income, academic record, including his/her performance in the admission entrance test. The scholarship will be awarded by the University on the recommendation of a Selection Committee consisting of following:

1. The Dean, Faculty of Social Science
 2. The Head of the Department of Economics.
 3. One Professor from the Department, to be nominated by the Head of the Department.
3. The payment of the scholarship amount will be made to the awardee through the Head of the Department on presentation of a bill and a certificate to the effect that the awardee was not in receipt of any other scholarship/financial assistance from any other source during the period covered in the bill.
 4. The scholarship will be renewed for the 2nd year on the awardee's passing the M.A. (Previous) examination in the first attempt.
 5. If it should appear at any time during the tenure of the scholarship that the student has failed to make satisfactory progress or has been found guilty of gross misconduct or has been irregular in attendance, it shall, after due warning in writing, be reported by the Head of the Department to the University, which may reduce, suspend or withdraw the scholarship.
 6. Any amount of interest earned by the endowment and not spent in any year will be added to the endowment.

Further resolved that the consequential amendments/ additions/ modifications, if any, be made in the Ordinances.

83/ Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee (Scholarships) made in its meetings held on 06.02.2008, 17.2.2009 and 28.8.2009 relating to institution of following Scholarships and Medals be accepted and recommended to the Executive Council for approval.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Add the following after Sr. No. 110:

111. Dr. Dev Raj Seth & Smt. Sushila Seth Scholarship

1. There shall be one scholarship to be known as “Dr. Dev Raj Seth & Smt. Sushila Seth Scholarship” to be awarded every year to a girl student studying in Delhi University out of the annual income accrued from the endowment of Rs.30,00,000/- (Rupees Thirty Lakhs Only) made by Dr. Mira Seth.
2. The Scholarship shall be awarded to a meritorious girl student with inadequate means pursuing studies at the Master’s level in the following courses on a rotational basis: 1. M.Tech. (Microwave); 2. M.Sc. in Nursing; 3. M.Sc. in Physics; 4. M.Sc. in Chemistry; 5. M.Sc. in Mathematical Sciences; 6. M.Sc. in Statistics; 7. M.Sc. in Operational Research; 8. M.Sc. in Computer Science; 9. M.A in Economics; 10. MBA (Full Time) in Management Studies; 11. M.Sc. in Environmental Biology; 12. M.Tech. (in any discipline); and 13. M.E. (in any discipline).
3. The value of the scholarship shall be Rs. 9,000/- p.m. or the income accrued from the corpus, whichever is less, and will be tenable for two year’s duration of the course. It would be renewed in the 2nd year subject to the awardee’s passing the Ist year examination.
4. No student shall be eligible for award of this scholarship if she already holds a scholarship awarded by Delhi University or any other University or the Central Government or any State Government or Private Body, other than freeship.
5. In case a scholar accepts any other scholarship/ financial assistance from any other source she shall be required to refund the amount received by her on this account from the date she accepts the other scholarship/ financial assistance.
6. If it should appear at any time during the tenure of the award that the scholar has failed to make satisfactory progress or has been found guilty of gross-misconduct or has been very irregular in attendance, it shall, after due warning in writing, be reported by the Head of the Institution/ Department to the University, who may reduce, suspend or withdraw her scholarship.
7. The scholarship shall be awarded by the Academic Council on the recommendation of a Selection Committee consisting of the following:-
 1. Dean, Faculty concerned
 2. Head, Department concerned
 3. Two senior teachers of the Department concerned
8. The payment of the scholarship amount shall be made to the scholar through the Head of the Institution from July each year on presentation of a bill along with a certificate to the effect that during the period covered in the bill/s the scholar was not in receipt of any other scholarship/ financial assistance from any other source.

9. The unutilized amount in any year shall be added to the corpus of the endowment fund.

112. Prof. K.N. Johri Memorial Scholarships

1. There shall be two Postgraduate scholarships called 'Prof. K.N. Johri Memorial Scholarships' for the students of M.Sc.(Chemistry) offering Inorganic Chemistry as specialization, payable out of the interest earned by the endowment of Rs.5 lac made by Mr. Rajive Johri.
2. The scholarships shall be of the value of Rs.1000/- pm each tenable for one year and shall be awarded every year to one male and one female student of M.Sc. (Chemistry) final year class, who secure the highest marks in the M.Sc.(P) examination in the University of Delhi. The scholarships shall be awarded strictly by merit.
3. In case the student(s) securing the highest marks in the M.Sc.(P) examination as above is/are in receipt of any other scholarships, the scholarships will be awarded to the next eligible candidate satisfying the above criteria.
4. The payment of these scholarships will be made to the students through the Head, Department of Chemistry on presenting a certificate/undertaking to the effect that the students were not in receipt of any other scholarship or financial assistance from any other source during the period.
5. Any amount of interest accrued from the endowment and not spent in any year shall be added to the corpus fund.

113. Justice Sunanda Bhandare Scholarship

1. There will be a scholarship known as "Justice Sunanda Bhandare Scholarship" payable out of the interest to be earned by the endowment of Rs. 2,00,000/- donated by Ms. Manali Singal and Mr. Rahul Bhandare, in the memory of their mother Justice Sunanda Bhandare.
2. The scholarship shall be of the value of Rs.1200/- per month or the amount of interest earned by the corpus, whichever is less, for ten academic months and will be awarded to a student of third year of the LLB course, who secures the highest percentage of marks in aggregate of Constitutional Law I & II and clears all papers of the second year in the first attempt. In case the topper is not eligible to get the scholarship for any reason, the same will awarded to the student who has secured the 2nd highest marks in the papers and so on.
3. No student shall be eligible for this scholarship if he/she already holds a scholarship awarded by Delhi University or any other University or the

Central Government or a State Government or a Private Body except free ship.

4. In case an awardee of this scholarship accepts any other scholarship/financial assistance from any other source, or an employment, he/she shall be required to surrender this scholarship and also refund the amount received by him/her on account of this scholarship from the date, he/she accepts the other scholarship/financial assistance.
5. In case a student discontinues studies without valid reasons, he/she shall be required to refund the amount received by him/her on account of this scholarship.
6. Any amount accrued from interest from the endowment and not spent in any year shall be added to the corpus of the endowment fund.

114. Prof. Sumati Mutatkar Scholarship

1. There shall be a Post-Graduate scholarship to be called “Sumati Mutatkar Scholarship” of the value of Rs. 6000/- p.a. or the amount of interest earned by the endowment of Rs. 1,00,000/- donated by Smt. Sunanda P. Bagadthey, whichever is less, to be awarded to a student of M.A. (Hindustani Music – Vocal) in the Faculty of Music and Fine Arts of the University of Delhi, who tops the M.A. (Hindustani Music – Vocal) Part-I examination in the first attempt.
2. In case the topper of the Part-I examination is ineligible to receive the scholarship for any reason, the scholarship may be awarded to the student who secures the 2nd position in the above examination and so on.
3. No student shall be eligible for this scholarship if he/she already holds a scholarship awarded by Delhi University or any other University or the Central Government or any state Government or a Private Body, except free ship.
4. In case an awardee of this scholarship accepts any other scholarship/financial assistance from any other source, or an employment, he/she shall be required to surrender this scholarship from the date he/she accepts the other scholarship/financial assistance or employment.
5. In case a student discontinues his/her studies without any valid reason he/she shall be required to refund the amount received by him/her on account of this scholarship.
6. Any amount of interest accrued from the endowment fund and not utilized in any year shall be added to the corpus of the endowment fund.

115. L.R. Bhansali Cash Award

1. There shall be a cash award to be known as “L.R.Bhansali Cash Award” of the value of Rs.6000/- p.a., or the amount of interest earned by the endowment of Rs. 1,00,000/- endowed by Sh. Sharad Bhansali.
2. The cash award will be awarded each year to a student of the LL.B of the Faculty of Law, University of Delhi who secures the highest marks in paper No. LB-5036 (International Trade Law) of the LL.B. V Term/Semester examination and passes all the papers of V semester in the first attempt.
3. In case the above paper is shifted from the V Semester/term to any other semester/term the award shall also be shifted accordingly.
4. If for any reason, this paper is discontinued at any stage in future, the endowment may be used for grant of a cash award to a student of Delhi University, who gets the highest overall marks in the V Semester/term examination in the first attempt.
5. In case the topper in the paper/examination of the LL.B is ineligible to get the scholarship, for any reason, the scholarship will be awarded to the student who secures the 2nd position in the examination and so on.
6. No student shall be eligible for award of this scholarship if he/she already holds a scholarship awarded by Delhi University or any other University or the Central Government or any State Government or Private Body, other than free ship.
7. In case the awardee accepts any other scholarship/financial assistance from any other source he/she shall be required to refund the amount received by him/her on this account from the date he/she accepts the other Scholarship/financial assistance.
8. If it should appear at any time during the tenure of the award that the scholar has failed to make satisfactory progress or has been found guilty of gross-misconduct or has been very irregular in attendance it shall, after due warning in writing to the student, be reported by the Head of the Institution/Department to the University, who may reduce, suspend or withdraw his/her scholarship.
9. The payment of the scholarship amount shall be made to the scholar through the Head of the Institution from July each year on presentation of a bill along with a certificate to the effect that during the period covered in the bill/s the scholar was not in receipt of any other scholarship/financial assistance from any other source.
10. The unutilized amount in any year shall be added to the corpus of the endowment fund.

116. Mitsubishi Corporation India Scholarships

1. There will be eight scholarships of the value of Rs. 62,500/- p.a. each to be awarded to the students of the Department of East Asian Studies in the following manner:-

Japanese Language:

- One Year Intensive Advanced Diploma - 2
- One Year Post Intensive Advanced Diploma - 2
- M.A. in Japanese (I year) - 1
- M.A. in Japanese (II year) - 1

East Asian Studies (only Japanese language associated students):

- M.A. in East Asian Studies (I year) - 1
- M.A. in East Asian Studies (II year) - 1

2. The above scholarships of the value of Rs. 62,500/-p.a. each will be awarded to the eight students of the Department of East Asian Studies as specified above and the total amount of the scholarships (Rs. 5 lac) shall be paid to the University by the Mitsubishi Corporation India Pvt. Ltd. annually.
3. The criteria for selection of the students for award of the following six scholarships shall be made on the basis of their ranks in the merit lists drawn by the department of East Asian Studies for admission to the respective courses:
 - One Year Intensive Advance Diploma in Japanese Language (2)
 - One Year Post Intensive Advance Diploma in Japanese Language (2)
 - M.A. in Japanese 1st year (1)
 - M.A. (East Asian Studies) 1st year (1)

The toppers of the merit lists shall be awarded these scholarships. In case the toppers are not eligible to get the scholarships, the scholarships shall be awarded to the students next in the merit lists.

4. Two scholarships will be awarded to the students of the Department of East Asian Studies who secure the highest aggregate marks in their respective Part-I examinations of M.A. (Japanese) & M.A. (East Asian Studies), provided the students have passed all the papers of M.A. Part-I in their first attempt. In case the topper of M.A. (P) is not eligible to get the scholarship for any reason, the scholarship will be awarded to the student next in the rank and so on.

5. The scholarships will be awarded subject to receipt of the funds from the donor.

117. Randhir Singh Scholarship

1. There will be a scholarship of the value of Rs.6000/-p.a. (or the amount of interest earned by the endowment of Rs.1 lac endowed by Smt. Anjani Singh, whichever is less) to be awarded to a student of M.A. Economics 2nd year of Delhi School of Economics who secures the highest marks in the M.A. Part-I examination in the first attempt.
2. The Scholarship will be awarded to the full time regular students of M.A. (Economics) of Delhi School of Economics.
3. The scholarship will be given to a student each year.
4. In case the topper of the M.A. (P) examination is not eligible to get the award for any reason, the scholarship shall be awarded to the student who is next to the topper and so on.
5. No student shall be eligible for award of this scholarship if he/she already holds a scholarship awarded by Delhi University or any other University or the Central Government or any State Government or Private Body, other than free ship.
6. In case a student accepts any other scholarship/financial assistance from any other source he/she shall be required to refund the amount received by him/her on this account from the date he/she accepts the other Scholarship/financial assistance.
7. If it should appear at any time during the tenure of the award that the scholar has failed to make satisfactory progress or has been found guilty of gross- misconduct or has been very irregular in attendance it shall, after due warning in writing to the student be reported by the Head of the Institution/Department to the University, who may reduce, suspend or withdraw his/her scholarship.
8. The payment of the scholarship amount shall be made to the scholar through the Head of the Institution from July each year on presentation of a bill along with a certificate to the effect that during the period covered in the bill/s the scholar was not any other source.
9. The unutilized amount in any year shall be added to the corpus of the endowment fund.

118. Prof. Gurbaksh Singh Scholarship

(Ref.: EC Res. No.161 dated: 13.11.98)

1. There will be a scholarship to be known as “Prof. Gurbaksh Singh Scholarship” of the value of Rs. 6000/- p.a. or the amount of interest fetched by the endowment of Rs.1 lakh whichever is less, to be awarded to one meritorious student of M.Sc.-Ph.D. programme in Biomedical Sciences in Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar Centre for Biomedical Centre belonging to weaker section of the society and who may not have the means to pursue higher education.
2. The scholarship will be tenable for a period of two years to pursue M.Sc. Course. The scholarship will be restricted to one student at a time, which means that the scholarship will be awarded in alternate years.
3. The selection shall be based on academic merit and interview with an additional consideration of the financial needs of the students. The Selection Committee shall comprise of the following:
 1. Director
 2. One Senior Member of ACBR (Nominated by the Director, ACBR)
 3. One Expert (Nominated by the Director, ACBR).
4. No student shall be eligible for the award of the scholarship if he/she already holds a scholarship awarded by Delhi University or any other University or the Central Government or any State Government or a Private Body other than free ship. In case a student, who has been awarded this scholarship, subsequently accepts any other scholarship/financial assistance from any other source, he/she shall be required to discontinue this award or refund the amount received by him/her on this account as applicable, except where the total fellowship available to the student does not exceed the total annual fees (including examination fees and other charges) charged by ACBR.
5. The scholarship will be renewed for the second year subject to the condition that the student passes the M.Sc. Part I examination in the first attempt.
6. If it should appear at any time during the tenure of the scholarship that the scholar has failed to make satisfactory progress or has been found guilty of gross misconduct or has been irregular in attendance it shall, after due warning in writing to the student, be reported by the Director, ACBR to the University, who may reduce, suspend or withdraw the scholarship.

97. PADMABHUSHAN PROFESSOR TIRUVENKATA RAJENDRA SESHADRI (FRS) COMMEMORATION GOLD MEDAL

1. There will be a Gold Medal instituted out of a corpus of Rs.2 lac donated by Prof. V. Peesapati, National Institute of Pharmaceuticals Education and Research, Hyderabad, in the memory of Prof. TR Seshadri.
2. The Gold Medal will be awarded to a student of Delhi University who secures the highest percentage of aggregate marks in M.Sc. Chemistry (Organic Chemistry) Parts-I & II taken together, in the first attempt.
3. The unutilized amount of interest, in any year, will be added to the corpus of the endowment fund.

Further resolved that the consequential amendments/ additions/ modifications, if any, be made in the Ordinances.

84/ Resolved that the following recommendations of Standing Committee (Scholarships) made in its meeting held on 28.08.2009 regarding minor amendments to be made in the Scholarship at Sr. 101 Mohd. Salam Azad Scholarship be accepted and recommended to the Executive Council for approval:

Existing Clause

2. The Scholarship shall be awarded strictly by merit to a student of M.A.(P) Persian who secures the highest percentage of marks in B.A.(H) Persian examination.

Amendment Approved

2. The Scholarship shall be awarded strictly by merit to a student of M.A.(P) Persian who has topped in the B.A. (H) Persian final year examination of the University of Delhi. In case, the topper of the examination is ineligible to get scholarship, it will be awarded to the student who secured the 2nd position in the merit and so on.
